More Folk and Acoustic Performances in 2009

In its 20th year of celebration the Nannup Music Festival holds close to his roots by remembering its beginnings as a small one venue folk festival. The 2009 festival will run over the March long weekend from 27 February to 2 March and will celebrate with an eclectic mix of music that reflects a strong emphasis on folk.

Over 200 artists will converge on the little town of Nannup and amongst them is a host of folk musicians. Arguably one of the worlds most accomplished and loved folk singers, Jez Lowe is coming and will be accompanied by Kate Bramley. County Durham singer-songwriter Jez and fiddle player Kate are coming to direct from the UK. Jez has toured the world for over 20 years and in that time has built up a formidable reputation with his songs amongst the most widely sung by folksingers and bands in the festival scene. Top of the line song writing with brilliant instrumentals and tight harmonies are guaranteed.

Other artists to fill the folk bill are festival favorite Bernard Carney. Bernard will be performing with David Hyams and together they will combine songs of depth and emotional power accompanied with very special guitar work. Bernard's songs have strong themes of social justice presented with his whacky sense of humor.

For the Blue Grass enthusiasts there is Lost and Found and the Nannup team and especially pleased to have the Cahoots Cajun Dance Band on board. They will get the toes tapping with their Cajun Dance Music from the Bayous and swamps of the southwest of Louisiana.
